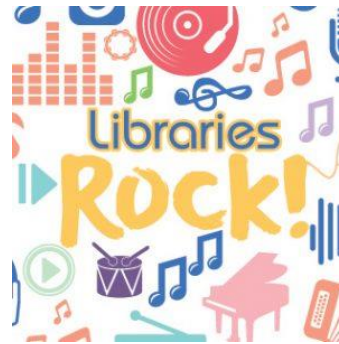

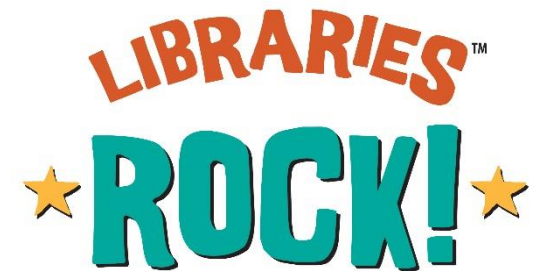

## Literacy Tips for Early Readers

- Encourage your older children to read to your younger children.
- Ask your child to read (or pretend to read) to you and make this reading enjoyable. Don't worry if your child does not read all of the words correctly, but applaud your child's efforts to read.
- Have books, magazines and newspapers around the house. Let your child see you reading.
- Encourage your child to write messages to family members, grocery lists, and postcards to friends. Don't worry about conventional spelling, but rather, praise their attempt at authorship.
- Read aloud to your child, pointing to words on the page as you read.
- Point out print/words in the child's environment: on cereal boxes, toys, restaurants, and traffic signs.
- Sing songs, recite short poems or nursery rhymes, and play rhyming word games with your child.
- Tell stories to your child and/or make up stories with your child.
- Read a short passage several times to your child until your child is able to read it with you.
